

The FASEB SRC **Hematologic Malignancies** has organized a series of 'Career-Oriented Workshops' as part of its scientific program, which will consider the many challenges in the transition from trainee to the next phase of one's research career. The first workshop will be panel led and focused on "Finding a Job and Starting an Academic Laboratory". The second will consider the challenges of the "Work/Life Balance" and will be co-led by Drs. Jonathan Licht, Director of the University of Florida Health Cancer Center; Kimberly Stegmaier, Vice Chair of Pediatric Oncology Research at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute; and Jane Skok, Principal Investigator at the NYU Langone Medical Center. The third session will focus on R01 and Foundation Funding for New Investigators and will be co-led by Dr. Adolfo Ferrando, the Leader of Lymphoid Malignancies and Development Program at the Herbert Irving Comprehensive Cancer Center; Dr. Iannis Aifantis, Chair of the Department of Pathology at NYU; and representatives from the Edward P. Evans Foundation. The workshops will conclude with a session led by Dr. Sylvia Buonamici, from H3 Biomedicine, focused on "Finding a Job in Industry."
